Starting July Kabel Deutschland's program package available in Baden-Wuerttemberg

- Kabel Deutschland concludes cooperation agreement with Kabel Baden-Wuerttemberg (Kabel BW)
- Distribution of Kabel Digital HOME package to 2.3 million customers in Baden-Wuerttemberg
- Kabel Digital HOME now available beyond Kabel Deutschland's initial territory

Unterfoehring, June 13, 2005 – Kabel Deutschland GmbH (KDG) has reached an agreement with Kabel BW, the cable TV operator in Baden-Wuerttemberg, about the marketing of its Kabel Digital HOME program package. This is the first time that the package will be available outside of the 13 states in which Kabel Deutschland already operates.

The cooperation with Kabel BW will allow an additional 2.3 million households to subscribe to the Kabel Digital HOME package starting July 1, 2005.

The package comprises 31 TV channels in the fields of entertainment, feature films, sports, documentaries, children's shows, music and erotic movies. Channels include Scifi, 13th Street, History Channel, National Geographic, Spiegel TV XXP Digital, Toon Disney, AXN, Kinowelt TV and Playboy TV, along with 47 digital radio stations.

“Ever since Kabel Digital HOME was introduced in late 2004, more and more customers have shown enthusiasm about our digital TV offering. We are very pleased that we are now able to extend this offer to the numerous viewers in Baden-Wuerttemberg who contact us and request subscriptions,” stated Dr. Manuel Cubero, director of cable TV at Kabel Deutschland. “This agreement clearly reaffirms our strategy, that is, working together with other cable network operators.”

“Kabel Digital HOME is a great program package with something to offer for the whole family at a very reasonable price,” said Georg Hofer, Managing Director of Kabel BW. “I am convinced that customers in Baden-Wuerttemberg will be keen to take advantage of this offer.”

After the successful launch, Kabel BW will market the KDG subscription package in its own right to customers in Baden-Wuerttemberg.

To date, Kabel Deutschland GmbH has distributed its digital program packages to nearly 10 million TV households in 13 Bundesländer in Germany. In mid-May 250,000 subscribers chose Kabel Digital HOME.

About Kabel Deutschland

Kabel Deutschland (KDG) operates cable networks in 13 of Germany's states and supplies around 10 million connected TV households in Germany. Kabel Deutschland is thus Europe's biggest cable network operator. The company develops new packages for digital TV, highspeed internet and additional services such as internet and telephone connection via cable. KDG offers an open platform for digital TV for all program providers. It operates the networks, markets cable connections and ensures comprehensive service for all matters of cable connectivity. In fiscal 2004/2005 the Company achieved revenues of more than € 1 bn (year ending March 31, 2005) and employed around 2,500 staff. In 2003, an investment consortium comprising Apax Partners, Providence Equity and Goldman Sachs Capital Partners took over Kabel Deutschland from Deutsche Telekom.

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
